From the Honorary Priest

Dear friends,

In Thinking be Mature - 1 Corinthians 14:20

Brothers and sisters, do not be children in your thinking; rather be infants in evil, but in thinking be mature.

When I looked up the readings for this week I was reminded of these words which the great 20th century theologian Paul Tillich used to name one of his sermons about 60 years ago.

St Paul was advising the early Christian community to be innocent in matters of evil, but in thinking about their worship they should seriously and

reflectively consider what was the best way to go about getting the outcome they desired, both for themselves and for newcomers in the faith.

The reading from Acts 5.27-32 does not really make much sense unless we know what comes before and after it. What does follow is wise advice given by the respected pharisee, Gamaliel, which is adopted by the high priest and elders of Israel.

I am on a mailing list of a friend who sends me articles which make me think and challenge my assumptions. Perhaps the two most pressing issues of our time are who will be the next president of the United States, and what do we do about the recently arrived refugees in Europe and Australia. You might like to look online at: we have to seriously consider a universal basic income - Robert Reich to see what a respected former Clinton administration Labour secretary has to say about the current state of America and who should be the next president of the United States.
