From the Honorary Priest

Dear friends,

Today we have the story of Paul's dramatic 'road to Damascus' experience. The phrase has become embedded in our culture and language We understand it to be an event or happening which is unexpected, dramatic, and has the consequence of a new way of living or understanding.

It seems a good time to learn more about this man Paul. I am indebted to Bishop John Shelby Spong who writes so sympathetically of Paul in his book Rescuing the Bible from Fundamentalism, 1991.

Spong asks the questions, 'What was Christ for Paul? Can the Christ who is the reality pointed to by all of Paul's words still be Christ for us? What did resurrection mean to Paul? Can we meet and know that power of resurrection? What was the meaning of grace for Paul? Can we enter the grace experience that changed Paul's life? These are the guestions to which our attention must now be drawn if we are to sing the Lord's song in this century.'

It is indeed a good time to find out the way a committed and learned bishop answers these questions.
