Psalm 80.1-2; 8-19

1 Hear, O Shepherd of Israel, you that led Joseph like a flock:

you that are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine out in glory;

2 Before Ephraim, Benjamin and Manasseh:

stir up your power, and come to save us.

8 You brought a vine out of Egypt:

you drove out the nations, and planted it in.

9 You cleared the ground before it:

and it struck root and filled the land.

10 The hills were covered with its shadow:

and its boughs were like the boughs of the great cedars.

11 It stretched out its branches to the sea:

and its tender shoots to the Great River.

12 Why then have you broken down its walls:

so that every passer-by can pluck its fruit?

13 The wild boar out of the woods roots it up:

and the locusts from the wild places devour it.

14 Turn to us again, O Lord of hosts:

look down from heaven, and see.

15 Bestow your care upon this vine:

the stock which your own right hand has planted.

16 As for those that burn it with fire and cut it down:

let them perish at the rebuke of your countenance.

17 Let your power rest on the man at your right hand:

on that son of man whom you made so strong for yourself.

18 And so we shall not turn back from you:

give us life, and we will call upon your name.

19 Restore us again, O Lord of hosts:

show us the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

# From the Locum Tenens Rector Psalm 80.1-19

This is truly the 'good shepherd' psalm in which God is addressed as the "Shepherd of Israel" (Ps. 23.1; 78.52; Isaiah 40.1-11) despite Israel's sordid and faithless past (Psalm 78) and its devastating present (Psalm 79). The kings and elites of Israel were thought of as shepherds (Jeremiah 23.1-6; Ezekiel 34) as are Christian pastors (1 Peter 5.1-5) and supremely Jesus (John 10). It is a metaphor of leadership of the people of God in the ways of God's justice, peace and mercy.

Israel is not only the flock but God's good vine (8-16), a planting meant to bear beautiful fruit (Isaiah 5.1-7; John 15.1-11).

Verses 1-2 pray for the return of God's presence: they long for God to shine forth like a fire on a mountaintop with his favour and mercy towards them. They long for God to rule from his throne on the cherubim, creatures associated with Ark of the Covenant and symbolic of the ruling Presence. They cry for God to defend them. God seems to them to be asleep so they pray for God to awake and come to them. The prayer asks that God restore them, bring them back from exile from God's presence, to restore them to the path of God's will. The prayer of "How long?" is always poignant (4-7) yet it is also the beginning of

hope. Despite their actions they can still cry out "How long?" and "restore us, make your face shine upon us" in the belief that, despite everything God will hear and respond.

The people (17-18) must find life in the LORD who is the source of life and no longer seek for it in themselves. That we have the voice to call is an act of grace without which we are lost. Even our calling in the midst of lostness and rebellion is grace. The psalmist looks to God's king 'the one at your right hand' to be God's agent of salvation, to support and empower them.

Question: Explore a time in your life when God has seemed to be asleep. Have you ever cried out, "How long"? This psalm is the cry of those who know that they have no claim on God except his grace. Is that the foundation of your life of prayer and worship? How important is that?
