From the Rector

Dear Friends,

This is an extraordinary night! It is as if the world suddenly pauses for a moment and all the busyness, the ordinary, the mundane falls away and we are able to glimpse what really matters. While Susan and I were travelling down from Brisbane to begin our new lives here at St Philip's we marvelled at the deep cuttings in the Pacific Highway north of Sydney. They reminded me of the Isaiah texts in the 'Messiah' that we have been hearing during Advent: Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill shall be made low; the uneven ground shall be made level, and the rough places a plain.... God cuts through.

I read this recently: God does not respond to his world. He does not adjust his reaction to suit good people or bad. You do not have to be good before God will love you; you do not have to try to be good before God will forgive you; you do not have to repent before you will be absolved by God. It is all

the other way around. If you are good, it is because God's love has already made you so; if you want to try to be good, that is because God is loving you; if you want to be forgiven, that is because God is forgiving you. You do not have to do anything, or pay anything in exchange for God's love. God does not demand anything of you. Nothing whatever.

The child in the manger speaks to us of vulnerability and risk; are we really prepared to love and be loved in this way? God's love can do terrible things to you. It may make you kind, considerate and loving and we know what happens to those kind of people! I hope and pray that we can be prepared to risk it! Have a very happy and holy Christmass.
