Psalm 30

1 I will exalt you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up from the depths: and have not suffered my foes to triumph over me.

2 O Lord my God, I cried to you:

and you have made me whole.

3 You brought me back, O Lord, from the land of silence:

you saved my life from among those that go down to the Pit.

From the Locum Tenens Rector Psalm 30

This psalm is an individual's thanksgiving for deliverance.

The psalmist has been a person who has gone from prosperity and security to near death and then God has delivered them (1-3). The poet has sunk so low that he can speak only of it as being 'in the depths' (Sheol, the Pit), a common expression for the human condition of despair, lostness and death. As in all falls, some people love to rejoice over the fallen and thus some did over the psalmist's failure.

The LORD responded, lifting the poet out of the depths, healing him and restoring him to life.

The poet invites the whole congregation to join him in praise and thanksgiving for God's gracious nature (4-5). God deserves praise because God's purpose for us is joy not wrath. Anger and suffering are not the last words that God has for us. Our folly and failure may bring some rebuke along the way but it is never permanent because God's desire for us is our joy. His grace is eternal and joy is its flower. (See Lamentations 3.22-23). Rejoicing is the true human vocation. Then the poet resumes his prayer story in 6-12. He found himself prosperous and thought that this meant he had God's favour. This theology gave him a false sense of security that tripped him up so that when he fell ill, lost his prosperity

and security, he thought that God had abandoned him. Prosperity is deadly dangerous for human flourishing (6-7) feeding a false sense of security that thinks that this state has come about because of our own efforts and not by the mercy and favour of God. But God quickly reminds him of who has made his "mountain stand firm."

It is prayer that brings the restoration of fellowship (8-10) and the desire to sing God's praise to the whole world.

So he cried to God, found the Lord's healing and mercy and returned from mourning to dancing, to joy and to praise. God's answer reverses everything because the LORD is a God of reversals. Praise is the way the faithfulness of the Lord becomes word and is heard in the Lord's world. Salvation is praise.
