Psalm 97

1 The Lord is king; let the earth rejoice:

let the multitude of islands be glad.

2 Clouds and darkness are round about him:

righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.

3 Fire goes before him:

and burns up his enemies on every side.

4 His lightnings light the world:

the earth sees it and quakes.

5 The mountains melt like wax before his face:

from before the face of the Lord of all the earth.

6 The heavens have proclaimed his righteousness:

and all peoples have seen his glory.

7 They are ashamed, all those who serve idols and glory in mere nothings: all gods bow down before him.

8 Zion heard and was glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoiced:

because of your judgements, O God.

9 For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth:

you are exalted far above all gods.

10 The Lord loves those that hate evil:

the Lord guards the life of the faithful, and delivers them from the hand of the ungodly.

11 Light dawns for the righteous:

and joy for the true of heart.

12 Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous:

and give thanks to his holy name.

From the Locum Tenens Rector Psalm 97

Like all the psalms in Book IV (90-106) this psalm is answering some of the problems of identity and integrity posed by the trauma of the exile of the people of God. Psalm 89 poses the questions most poignantly as the conclusion to Book III; how can we live without the Davidic King, what has happened to the covenant, no temple, no land, no king. So who is in charge?

Psalm 97 affirms the theology at the heart of the Psalter: God reigns. The psalm celebrates God's cosmic reign; the whole created order is God's kingly, glorious garment (1-5). God's reign is a cause of rejoicing for the world but it is contested. God has adversaries who wish to bring down his rule of righteousness and justice and thus destroy joy in the world. Even the gods pay homage to the Lord for they are of the creation, not its maker (6-9). But this same God creates relationships that are just and right

and loving, opposed to all evil and destruction, because that is the creator's nature.

Evil there most certainly is and God's people suffer under it but such evil cannot stand against the just God (10-12; see the story in Acts 16.16-34). God's love and justice still have their adversaries. The task of the disciple is to live life under the banner, God reigns.

The resurrection of Jesus is the ultimate demonstration of the sovereignty of the just and loving God. God delivered him from the thrall of the wicked and light shone in the darkness and joy filled the hearts of those who heard the news and believed.

Question: How does God reign in our lives? Is it a cause of rejoicing? What do justice and righteousness mean for us? Ponder the pain that lack of justice and righteousness brings to humankind.
