Song of Isaiah

'Behold, God is my salvation:

I will trust and will not be afraid:

'For the Lord God is my strength and my song:

and has become my salvation.'

With joy you will draw water:

from the wells of salvation.

On that day you will say:

'Give thanks to the Lord, call upon his name;

'Make known his deeds among the nations:

proclaim that his name is exalted.

'Sing God's praises, who has triumphed gloriously:

let this be known in all the world.

'Shout and sing for joy, you that dwell in Zion:

for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.'

Isaiah 12.2-6

From the Locum Tenens Rector

A Song of Isaiah (Isaiah 12:2-6) The theme of joy is continued from the reading Zephaniah 3.14-20 ('Rejoice and exult with all your heart.") in this little collection of brief songs of praise. Once again praise arises from reversal (11:10-16) in which the LORD promises to reverse exile slavery and captivity (this time the Assyrian 721 BC) and bring the exiles home rejoicing, just as they had done in the Exodus. God changes things. That is good news.

Confidence and trust in God who will save is the key theme (2-3). God is the God of salvation, my salvation and that dispels all fear. God is my strength and might. The trust is intensely personal and grounded in the character of God who by nature is salvation. No wonder salvation is pictured as a well of water; the source of life that we can go to with confidence and great joy. Trust replaces fear with joy.

The earth and its nations should know that God is the God of salvation whose word we can trust and so the people of God should proclaim his great deeds in the whole earth (4-6).

Worship and justice belong together in the prophets. It is when we know the justice, mercy and faithfulness of God that we can rejoice and draw the nations into worship. Letting the praise of God be heard throughout the earth is the mission of the church, just as it was the mission of Israel. The psalm poses a question: Does our worship joyously proclaim to the world that God has done gloriously?
