Greetings to all!

Today's story about the children being brought to Jesus points out that even without reaching the "years of discretion" having been brought to the Lord by parents of faith children are already members of God's family and therefore the Kingdom of God. Jesus uses them as models of what it means to be members of the Kingdom and therefore disciples!

The story which follows offers a contrast. The rich young ruler supposed that entry into the kingdom was to be earned by gradually moving up the steps of religious belief to the point where he could trust God and no longer in his wealth. What is needed is for the man to be willing to be like the little children, to let go of his wealth and trust.

Last week Betty Heaton asked me to remember Dot Vousden in our prayers as Dot had passed away that morning. Dot and Les Vousden were members of St Philip's way back at the beginning in the 1950's when Les was the principal at Telopea Park School. The brass candlesticks on the altar are a gift from them. They are inscribed "In Loving Memory of George Harrington / Dot and Les Vousden Janice and Dianne / St Philip's O'Connor". Fortunately the candlesticks were beautifully polished and shining as we gave thanks for Dot.

We also give thanks today for Erhard Timmel (uncle of Ann Munro) who came to Australia to be an engineer on the Snowy Mountains Scheme.
