## KEY POINTS FROM MAY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The Parish Council has had a first discussion on how to develop **“a multi-year plan to build and grow the Parish and its mission”** as set out in the Covenant between Rebecca and the Parish. The aim is to complete consultations and reach agreement on a plan by mid 2011 if possible. Further Council discussion and consultations will be needed before finalising details of the process but it will be very much one with opportunities for all parishioners to contribute.

The Council has agreed that St. Philip's will participate in **“Back to Church Sunday”** on 29 August.

The Council has submitted an order for a 3.74KW **solar electricity** generation system. The system will be erected on the roof of the Church Hall over the next two months or so. It has been possible to fund this purchase from the generous donations of parishioners. See the accompanying note in the pewsheets.

An application has been submitted to ACT Heritage for a dollar for dollar grant to replace the **parquet floor in the sanctuary** with new parquet in the same Tasmanian oak. Successful applicants will be advised in September. In the meantime, parishioners using the sanctuary should be alert to loose pieces of parquet and take care.

**The Twilight Community Fair** will be held on Saturday 13 November. Ben and Fiona Dyer have very kindly offered to coordinate the Fair this year.

Greetings!

I am delighted to report that St Philips has received enough donations to install a 3.74-kilowatt solar panel system on the roof of our kindergarten. Pyramid Power has been engaged to complete the work and we are hoping that the panels will be installed by the end of June. This is exciting for a number of reasons. It establishes an income stream for the next 20 years and thereby offsets our power consumption; it supports the growing renewable power industry and helps us move from a fossil fuel dependent economy and it is a significant sign to the community that we are serious about the environment. As people of faith we must always do more than just 'talk'. We must act according to our principles. According to the Anglican Communion 5 Marks of Mission, which our diocese has adopted, one of the central principles of our life together is good stewardship of God's creation.

I am aware that the installation of solar panels is not without controversy in our community. There are arguments about the cost of such systems being passed on to the consumer – all consumers – and there is the debate about the effectiveness of such schemes. This short piece is not the place to go into all the complex arguments and detail and I am no energy expert. Also these discussions often become more about politics than clear facts. However it is true that to change from one way of channelling and using energy to another is not a smooth process. There will be difficulties and disagreement and energy costs will increase. This is actually meant to encourage reduced energy consumption. Ultimately the best way to save money and the environment is to use less energy. On weighing up the pros and cons parish council believe this is the right way forward for St Philips. We are part of a growing number of Australian churches, including many in our own diocese, who are installing solar panels as we commit to caring for our planet home. The whole cost of the installation is being borne by people who have donated to the project. No costs come out of the parish budget. For such generosity parish council and myself are very grateful and heartened.
