### From the Rector

Dear Friends,

'I am the resurrection and the life,' famous words spoken by Jesus at the death of his friend Lazarus. They were to remind Martha that her brother was not resurrected but was to return to life 'so that God may be given glory.' It was to demonstrate that the 'new life' of faith, being 'born again', 'seeing anew' sharing in the waters of eternal life is often one of difficulty, crisis, challenge as well as joy. Lazarus, after all, was pursued by the authorities following this event - they sought to kill him along with Jesus. He has been described as the most unfortunate man ever because he died twice!

Lazarus has been a familiar character in the political landscape of this country. In 1989 John Howard lost the liberal leadership to Andrew Peacock and when asked whether he could become Liberal leader again, Howard likened it to 'Lazarus with a triple bypass!' He went on of course to become Liberal leader and titled his autobiography 'Lazarus rising.' Politics however by its very nature is about rise and fall and as we know Howard was to lead the Liberal party to defeat and was famously to lose his own seat. Rise and fall: much like the little deaths and renewals that are the marks of the life of faith. Lazarus' raising was of this order.

Jesus words 'I am the resurrection and the life' remind us that we 'share' in his resurrection. It is a shared experience, something that the entire created order groans and longs for. We share in the ups and downs as we share in Christ's sufferings so that we might share in his resurrection, we are after all his body, and where the head has gone so the body must follow.

As I write plans are well advanced to celebrate Betty Heaton's funeral. She was a friend to many of you and a long time parishioner of St Philip's, one of the originals. We assure her family of our prayers at this time. Blessings, Martin
