From the Rector

Dear Friends

Today is a very appropriate feast day on which to conclude the Church's year. It is by Church standards a modern feast, not yet 100 years old. It was inaugurated in 1925 by Pope XI; at that time there was clear movement towards secularism and from there totalitarianism. The political extremes of fascism and communism were becoming present in the period between the wars, and the inauguration of the festival was a call to the Christian world to respond to the question: to whom should we give our allegiance?

Today's gospel passage gives us something of an idea about this 'King' to whom we are called to worship, it's about spiritual leadership. It presents Jesus as both shepherd and sheep, as judge and king on the one hand and as suffering humanity on the other. Works of mercy are the measure of justice or righteousness. Those who feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, and set the prisoners free are "the righteous/the sheep" who will inherit God's empire or kingdom and enter eternal life. Those who fail in these respects are the unrighteous/the goats who don't recognise the presence of the shepherd/king in suffering humanity. I guess that the word which draws all this thinking together is 'justice.' I read once that the opposite of poverty is not wealth but justice. The issues that we face in our modern world can, so often, be traced to the fundamental problem of justice.

Today we celebrate the baptism of Taryn Gowty, a great day for both Taryn's family and for the parish family. In baptism we are made one and the mark of our unity is justice and from there shalom – peace, the peace that is offered by the risen Jesus who is King! Our festival today, with the reading from Matthew 25, coupled with Taryn's baptism

provides us with the essence of Christianity. The authentic Christian faith is to be incorporated into the life of Christ. This in turn means sharing in the divine life of the Trinity which is relationship par excellence. To share in this life is to play a role in envisioning the kingdom that Christ inaugurated, a kingdom which is justice and peace.

Our increasingly secular world might poo poo such ideas! It really gets my goat!!! I find them completely reasonable, in fact I believe that the future of humanity depends on such a way of thinking.
