

Dear Friends,

When I was thinking about songs for St Matthew's day a tune kept going round ar head, but I couldn't find the song in our new hymn book. So I rang up a musical f and she got back to me with what I wanted, and sure enough it's not in our new I the Australian Hymn Book.

So I reproduce it here and we will sing it at the close of the service.

It's a great tune, and the words are exactly right for the tax collector Matthew. A couldn't Jesus — the messiah 'the anointed one — find someone more suitable to disciples. Or could it be that Jesus and the first Christians had a sense of humour trying to tell us something?

I sing a song of the saints of God, patient and brave and true, who toiled and fought and lived and died for the Lord they loved and knew: and one was a doctor, and one was a queen, and one was a shepherdess on the green: they were all of them saints of God: and I mean, God helping, to be one too.
