We come today to the great celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. The one who was put to death is risen! We share in his resurrection through our faith and baptism! Today celebrates the new life that God gives life that conquers all the worst that can happen and promises life beyond death. May we celebrate this day with hope and joy and may the Risen Lord be present to us always!

In baptism we recall Jesus' own baptism and dramatically act out the themes of dying and rising! We also recall the liberation of God's people through the Red Sea! It is a great joy to celebrate the baptism of Zara Claire Mann in our midst at 10.00am today. Over the last few years we have been blessed with Leighton and Ruth 's friendship and love and it was a special joy to have little Zara born into our parish family. Whereas the crucifixion stories show remarkable similarity the resurrection appearances are not able to be so clearly defined or "pinned down " because they are much more individual personal and subjective. We might think of our own experience of resurrection! The resurrection does not make Christ's ministry a thing of the past, instead it is a handing on of that ministry to the church!
