Hi Everyone!

It has been a busy week at the Canberra Hospital for members of St Philip's! First of all little Noah James Palethorpe was born at 11.59pm on Sunday evening! We welcome little Noah to the big wide world and congratulate Stephen and Rebecca while celebrating a new baby brother for Elise and Jarrah and grandson for Hardy and Helen. Noah has had something of an uphill battle with the diagnosis of a faulty valve in his heart and he is now off the critical list awaiting surgery at Westmead Children's Hospital. We pray for Noah and Rebecca and Stephen in this anxious time. Fortunately all the other hospital news is good with Zara Mann recovering well after surgery. Elizabeth Allinson is also greatly improved although a little tired. Denise Manley has also recovered well after her knee surgery but is away today at the Dedication of her granddaughter Grace at the Church of Christ.

The terrible events in Saudi Arabia this week where so many people were killed by terrorists in Khobar highlights the importance of oil in the world economies and the dependence on outside workers for the operation of the oil industry there. Following what I said a few weeks ago about the economic issues involved in encouraging terrorism I wonder if the employment of foreign workers grates on the sensibilities of those who are poor and unemployed in Saudi Arabia or if it is just blind hatred of westerners. Although the poor may not have the necessary skills or willingness to fulfil the roles of overseas workers it must still be a source of misunderstanding and disempowerment to see so many foreigners helping to extract the nations oil. The issues it raises for me, however, are largely environmental and point to the even greater need to move to alternative non fossil fuel forms of energy.

Be on the lookout for O'Connor wildlife! We have discovered a possum that uses our toilet and toilet paper! He/she sleeps among

the toilet paper storage in the cupboard and drinks from the toilet bowl and goes to the toilet on the floor! Such behaviour is not appropriate for an Anglican possum so we have had to evict it. Then on Wednesday I found a yabby walking along a footpath near the O'Connor shops in the rain. Needless to say I was amazed but there are witnesses! I returned him/ her to the pond behind the shops.

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity the wonderful mystery of God, Creator, Word and Spirit of Grace, three persons and yet ONE GOD. No we do not fully understand the nature of God who remains a mystery. All our attempts at language to describe God and efforts to develop symbols for the Trinity sooner or later run into difficulty. The best evidence for the Trinitarian nature of God is our experience of God who is transcendent creator, communicating word, and ever-present breath and fire of grace. Today we celebrate the wonder and mystery of God's completeness...All in All!
