From Rob

Hi Everyone

Yesterday I went to Goulburn for the ordination of Trevor Edwards as bishop. It was as usual a grand occasion with clergy and bishops from all parts of Australia in their finest regalia as well as many friends and family and members of parishes. It was the best Cathedral service I have experienced in a long time, relaxed and yet dignified, there were a collection of inspiring hymns and the addition of a singing group with a few modern songs at Communion. The choir and musical director resisted the urge to sing in the usual style and so most choir pieces had some strength. The sermon from Archbishop Peter Watson from Melbourne was very good and clearly delivered. The whole event was so encouraging and inspiring it was well worth the trip.

Now of course we have a new bishop who will be our second Assistant Bishop. Bishop Trevor will be largely responsible for growing communities of faith and enabling parishes to be "Communities Confident in Christ ". We pray for Trevor and Ruth Edwards as they follow their new calling from within their base at St Matthew's in Wanniasa.

One archbishop who was not in attendance yesterday was Ian George who after much controversy over the management of allegations of child sexual abuse resigned from his position as Archbishop of Adelaide. It seemed a sad end for a man who has served in so many ways and who was only weeks away from retirement. The allegations did not relate to the archbishop but there were serious questions about how the allegations were handled. Im disappointed for him because I always found Ian George a wise and helpful guide on spiritual and pastoral matters when he was Assistant Bishop in this diocese.

The events in Adelaide remind us that the issue of child abuse and sexual abuse will not simply go away and that we are to be vigilant at all times to protect the children in our care. We need also in protecting our children need to protect each other from any suspicion by dealing with each other in an open way always ensuring that there are no grounds for accusation. For this reason the Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn expects each parish to have a policy on Child Protection. The Parish Council on Wednesday night adopted the Diocesan policy as our parish policy. Please see the item at the top of the next page for details.

Following Pentecost and Trinity Sunday we move into the long season of Sundays of the Pentecost season. As the name suggests these Sundays follow themes about living the Christian life "Christ living in us " under the inspiration and energy of God's Holy Spirit. The theme today ties forgiveness with the need for justice as essential for the Christian life.

It seems the first few weeks of little Noah's life have been pretty trying but the news for now is good. He has come through the operation to repair a faulty heart valve and is off the ventilator and requiring only the basic monitors. His blood circulation and pulse are OK Rebecca tells me he is out of Intensive Care and has moved to the next level Extended Care. Rebecca is able to hold and feed Noah. Stephen and Rebecca with Elise and Jarrah are at Ronald McDonald House and it may be up to a week before they can return to Canberra. I imagine everyone including Noah is very tired but Bec was not showing it. We continue to pray that further ultrasound tests will show the surgery to have been successful however we know that with such problems this is the beginning of a long journey to healing.
