Hi Everyone,

While I am away with Devin Combs Bowles and Dimitri Markotsis at Synod the Rev'd Jeannette McHugh is presiding and preaching at the Eucharist at 8am and 10am.

Synod this year is in Wagga Wagga with services at St John's while the business of Synod is conducted at the Charles Sturt University. There will of course be much to discuss from the Diocesan Mission Plan to Ordinances about Professional Standards and the Governance of the Diocese. The Financial Reports of the Diocese will be discussed as well as National Church issues such as Women Bishops, Lay Presidency at the Eucharist and the location and role of the Anglican Primate (currently the Archbishop of Perth). All issues about which you are no doubt keenly interested!!! Synod representatives will be reporting on the important aspects of Synod over the coming weeks.

Just this week a leaflet about Spring @ St Philip's has been sent out to (I hope) all members of the St Philip's family. The first event advertised is the Pandora's at O'Connor fashion parade on 0 October. The second is The St Philip's Fete on 16th October this year! There is a list of stalls and activities on the notice board in the porch! Please indicate on the list if you can coordinate a stall or be a helper! Sadly the load falls to a faithful few who do not get to see the rest of the fete. Please volunteer even a small amount of your time to assist on a stall or event. Even an hour of your time will make the fete that much greater a success!

Election fever follows football fever! The Federal election is on 9th October! Why not vote on the way to the Pandora's at O'Connor fashion parade. The ACT Assembly election is on 16th October vote early and come to the fete afterwards! The Parish Annual Election for Wardens and Parish Councillors will be conducted on Sunday 24th October BEFORE the 10am Eucharist. A number of members of Parish Council have decided not to seek re election! If you are interested in offering for election to Parish Council or as Warden please indicate your interest on the notice in the porch. It is really important to have nominations ready before the meeting! Please begin asking thinking

and praying about suitable people to fill some of the gaps.

As we emerge from winter the St Philip's finances are stretched. This is the time of year to catch up on your giving if it has fallen behind and to re think your commitment to providing the resources for the future. In plain terms your giving! Sets of envelopes are available for regular weekly giving as well as the Anglican Direct debit scheme operated by our Anglican Development Fund If you prefer you can give through Internet banking by using the information on the form provided Even a modest increase \$2 per week per person means an extra \$52 per year. An increase of \$2 per family per week would mean almost \$100 per week and \$5000 per year. My main concern is that we pay our Mission Commitment of \$3000!

Today's gospel can be confusing! The secret is in verse 8 where the man is commended for his shrewdness NOT his dishonesty! The story is about the use of our wits and resourcefulness in God's service. It seems to me to be about breaking the mould of our thinking and being truly open to alternatives in the way we respond to God
