Greetings Everyone.

Today we celebrate the life and ministry of our patron saint Philip the Apostle and Martyr! I get annoyed when Philip's name is spelt incorrectly with two Ls! I regularly tell people that we are named after the Philip in the New Testament and not the first Governor of New South Wales (Captain Arthur Phillip) or the suburb Canberra! Usually May 3rd is observed as "St Philip and St James, Apostles and Martyrs" and we conveniently leave James out of the picture. I am grateful to Brian McKinlay for the wonderful leaflet on St Philip however with all that information ...What am I left to write about?

Well first of all I would like to point out just who the James is remembered with Philip! James is most likely "James the Less" or "James the son of Alphaeus" who is listed among the twelve called "Apostles" by Jesus. There are three James' in the New Testament. The two others are — 'the Lord's brother' mentioned in Mark ch.6, 'the Great' apostle the son of Zebedee mentioned often with his brother John and Peter. James is sometimes identified as "James the Lord's brother" but this is unlikely. Apart from these conjectures nothing more is known of James. Our second reading from 1 Corinthians mentions James. This James is most likely the Lord's brother and not the son of Alphaeus. Fortunately we have much more information about Philip in the writings of the Gospel according to John. Please see Brian's leaflet!

I was well and truly ANZACed last weekend and frankly found the whole thing a little overwhelming. I saw my old friend Chaplain Eric Burton (senior Navy Chaplain) at ANZAC Cove and noticed that all he had to do was read some prayers. A free trip to Anzac Cove to say two prayers! What a life!

Last Tuesday there was an article by the Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams in the Canberra Times where he examined the relationship between economy and ecology. He pointed out that so often ecology loses out in favour of economy and the quest for growth. Instead he says ecology should dictate economy because the

ecology is the sum of all we have. I have taken a couple of copies for any interested people. Another very challenging address came from Archbishop Njongonkulu Ndungane at St Georges Cathedral Capetown about the [balance of wealth and trade](#). It is also well worth the read!
