Greetings Everyone!

Today is Trinity Sunday! Our picture of God is complete Father Creator, Son and Redeemer, Spirit of Grace although we are prevented from seeing the fullness of God by our human limitations. In Advent we celebrated the God of Creation who promises to intervene in world affairs! At Christmas we ponder the mystery of the Word made flesh in the babe of Bethlehem the Son and Redeemer! Now the end of Jesus' ministry and his sharing the Father's glory brings the Spirit. ONE God – THREE Persons not operating in separation but in unity!

The Sundays of Pentecost (of which today is the second) celebrate our life in relationship with the fullness of God and week after week from now until Advent aspects of our life with God (life in the Spirit) are the focus of the scripture readings.
