Dear Everyone,

Welcome to St. Philips!

Firstly, a special welcome to Chris Cheah who is our preacher for this third Sunday of Advent. Our theme today is Joy! Joy is of course one of the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit mentioned in Galatians 5. The others are love, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. For me joy conjures up visions of jumping up and down when something wonderful has happened or the feeling you get when you hear the Hallelujah chorus from the Messiah! It can also be that deep feeling of happiness that moves you to tears. However in the New Testament joy is more than a feeling. It is both an attitude of mind and an action built on faith and trust in God. It is something we can have in our lives through the grace of God.

There's plenty of reason in the world in which we live to be sad, distressed, disturbed, upset, concerned, anxious, stressed out, full of fear, doubt... but not for the Christian. We are commanded to rejoice always. And that's not an isolated command... seventeen times in Paul's letter to the Philippians alone he talks about joy. Just a few of those come to mind. In Philippians chapter 2, Paul says things like "Even if I am being poured out as a drink offering upon the sacrifice and service of your faith, I rejoice and share my joy with you all and you too rejoice in the same way and share your joy with me," no matter what's going on. Even if I am a prisoner and even if I might lose my life and wind up being a sacrifice to get the gospel to you, I rejoice, I share my joy with you, I expect you to rejoice and share your joy with me. In chapter 4 verse 4, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say rejoice." The actual Greek tense is present which basically means we are meant to rejoice in every moment of every day.

How can we possibly rejoice always? It sounds unrealistic and very pie in the sky. However this joy is built on faith and trust, in the knowledge that in Jesus Christ we have the surest ground for joy.

Part of Jesus' message was that we were not to worry or stress or despair but to rest in the love of God. In Advent our joy is part of the certainty we have that Christ has come, is present and will come again. Joy also comes when we align ourselves with God and God's ways and love as Christ loves.

The St. Philip's "Friendly Ladies" have been doing their bit to spread some Advent joy with the donation of a Christmas hamper and presents to those in need. Thank-you to the ladies for their generosity.
