I have spent the last week at the annual clergy conference at Bateman's Bay. The theme of the conference was ecclesiology vs. missiology.

The conference was a great opportunity to catch up with colleagues and to see what we were all doing in our neck of the woods. Most clergy work in isolation from their fellow ministers and the main value of the conference is to offer support and encouragement to each other. It is even more important for rural clergy.

One topic on our minds was the news headlines about a potential split in the Anglican Communion. This seems to be a sword of Damocles that hangs over our heads. While we sit here waiting to see if and when it will drop it is worth keeping in mind three things. Firstly as Bishop George has said this is not a problem affecting the Australian Province of the Anglican Communion. Nationwide there is no talk of breaking communion between any of the 23 Australian dioceses or any other diocese to my knowledge. Secondly, and to my way of thinking most important, Christian unity is based on our individual communion and unity with Christ. We are not "married" to one another.

We are each of us bound to God, through Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. It is through this shared experience that we are bound together. I find it very difficult when I hear people talk of schism and separation because it implies that one Christian can judge whether another is in communion with the triune God. Surely that judgement belongs to God? And finally, the discussion paper that the headlines were drawn from is just that — a discussion paper.

The problems affecting the Anglican Communion are complex and not easily solved. The catalyst issue may appear to be the contentious subject of homosexuality but there are other drivers operating. Such issues include the colonial history of Africa, the understanding of biblical authority, the interpretation of scripture and quite frankly issues of politics, power and honour. One of the truly great strengths of the Canberra-Goulburn Diocese is the willingness of the vast majority of people to work together and to honour difference and diversity.

Well, enough of the Anglican Church! On a global scale it is the growing environmental crisis, the growing chasm between the rich and the poor and the escalation of violence and retribution in the

Middle East that seem to me to be of greatest concern. The gospel reading for today is a long one but in it are contained some of the most amazing stories of healing. It is on modelling our behaviour on Christ that we can be part of bringing healing to the world around us. It is through unity with Christ that we can be inclusive and loving to all. It is by striving to have the heart and mind of Christ that we can understand and live with all paradox and contradiction. The prayer of St. Patrick is one that comes to mind:

Christ be with me, Christ within me,
Christ behind me, Christ before me,
Christ beside me, Christ to win me,
Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me,
Christ in quiet, Christ in danger,
Christ in hearts of all that love me,
Christ is mouth of friend and stranger.
