

Dear Everyone,

Well after our string of eventful Sundays we now move into what is commonly referred to as Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time are the periods which do not fall under the "strong seasons" of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter. The term Ordinary does not mean common or plain, but is derived from the term ordinal or "numbered." The weeks in ordinary time are numbered as you will see on the front of the pew sheet. No Sunday celebration is ever ordinary or plain as Sunday by Sunday we celebrate the risen Lord. Every Sunday we celebrate new beginnings, new hope, new life. However Ordinary Time does give us an opportunity to reflect on the teachings of Jesus week by week. The word ordinary does have connotations of a more rhythmic, quieter time. A time to perhaps go inward and be a little more settled. It is a time that suits our cold winter months very well!

A thoughtful parishoner sent me an article called Why I am still an Anglican by Edward Lucas, a correspondent with The Economist. Here is a quote from the article:

So, for the first time in my adult life, I now feel that my faith and my life are firmly in tune. The Church's job is to provide a framework for modern life, and to fill the gaps. If the secular world is busy, ugly, shallow and selfish, the Church offers peace, rhythm, contemplation, humility, aesthetic riches, history, friendship — all combined in a narrative that makes sense of our actions, hopes and fears. The strands of belief that have passed through my fingers in the past decades have finally knit together; I have never felt more strongly tied to the Church.

Lucas I think puts his finger on the essence of Ordinary Time — the rhythm, the peace, the contemplation, the quiet friendship, the time to sit with the Narrative of Jesus and reflect on what his teachings mean for us. Sometimes we sit in the church pews and ask ourselves why we are here yet again. The church is such a flawed institution after all. Perhaps it is that underneath our doubt, restlessness and frustrations is the quiet insistent voice of the Holy Spirit leading us to the possibility that we will find a thread of hope, a chance to sit and just be with God, the space to immerse ourselves in the richness

of Gods story and the strength to walk in the loving way of Christ.
We need to remember we need each other for the journey as well!

Next week we welcome Chris Cheah back to the pulpit! Chris's sermons are always thought provoking and a joy to listen to.
