Dear Everyone,

A special welcome to the family and friends of Alyssa Grace Towney! Alyssa will be baptised today and welcomed into the family of Christ. Her parents are Paul and Donna-Maree and she has four godparents — Shane and Laurie Austin and John and Judith Woods.

Baptism is one of the most special celebrations. It is a ritual that is full of meaning and symbolism. The liturgy we use from the prayer book tries to capture some of that depth. In simple terms Baptism is a sign of our one-ness with God and commitment to follow in the path of Jesus and it is a sign of our membership in the universal Christian community. Like the Eucharist, the sharing of consecrated bread and wine, it is a visible sign of God's enduring and steadfast love. What God's love will mean for Alyssa as she takes the great journey of life will be revealed in time. She needs the prayers, nurturing, encouragement, guidance and support of her family and friends — as we all do.

God's love is so profound, so liberating and so amazing. Anyone who has found the "pearl of great price" knows these facts very well. Christians are called to proclaim this good news, the good news of God's love and Kingdom made manifest in Jesus Christ. We do that in all sorts of ways — mostly by our actions of loving service. St. Philips is about to embark on a journey of welcoming others to either join us on this path of loving and being loved by God and of loving others and the whole of creation or of deepening our own understanding of what that means. So today is also the "official" launch of the catechumenate process here at St. Philips. The team and parish council have decided to call the journey "Come and See". St. Philippians will recognise that these are the words Philip said when Nathanael asked him on hearing about Jesus, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"; "Come and see", replied Philip (John 1. 46) . I encourage everybody to read the bits of paper inserted in the bulletin and to also think of anyone who might like to be part of — "Come and See" and to give them the invitation. Next Sunday is Creation Sunday. Usually this event is held earlier in the year but was rescheduled for October. Creation Sunday is a day to reflect on our place in this awesome universe and to consider the environment and how we can best care for it.
