Dear Everyone,

The Synod Sarah Gowty, Brian McKinlay and I attended last weekend in Goulburn was a celebratory affair with an emphasis on wellbeing. There were a couple of very significant motions passed including two on the Middle East and one on Diversity in the Anglican Church. Ashton Robinson is going to give a short report about synod for us all. However below is the text of an email sent from central office last week about one of the resolutions:

Aid for the Middle East

The Diocesan Synod passed a resolution setting the challenge of raising \$30,000 from the Diocese to assist the humanitarian work of the Anglican Church in the Middle East: Gaza or Lebanon. The 330 members of synod personally donated or pledged over \$4,000 to the fund before they left for home last Sunday. The Bishop of Jerusalem, The Rt Rev'd Riah H. Abu El-Assal, will be in Canberra on Wednesday 27 September and will be giving a lecture at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture that evening. Bishop George intends to assure Bishop Riah that the Diocese will raise this money.

Please support this compassionate work of our Church. These donations are tax deductible and can be made either through your Parish or directly by phone or online to AngliCORD [Anglicans Cooperating in Overseas Relief and Development] and ABM [Anglican Board of Mission - Australia].

I wholeheartedly commend this endeavour to you all. The target set is very manageable for the diocese as a whole. Whatever way you can help, no matter how small, will go towards the target. Sometimes the needs of so many people and situations in our world seem overwhelming. I was chatting with a friend last week about the impending climate change crisis amongst other things. She was feeling weighed down and helpless and felt as if it did not matter what she did, nothing would improve. Politicians would not listen if she wrote letters; the small amount of money she could donate to causes would not really change anything and her meagre efforts to reduce the use of her car or shop as ethically as possible would have no impact. She was right of course but if all of us took similar steps then it truly would make a difference and quite quickly. It is not that we cannot change anything. It is as a people as a whole, working together, that we lack the will.

Perhaps the problem is that in the face of so many problems we no longer have hope. Hope is called the quintessential Christian virtue for with hope all other things become possible - forgiveness, love of neighbour, reconciliation, care of the earth, a church community thriving and growing. Without hope there is only despair. May the Holy Spirit stir up hope within us so we can take the steps, one day at a time that will make the difference.
