*Greetings to all!*

*The week of Prayer for Reconciliation began on Tuesday after the Anniversary of Sorry Day last Monday. On ABC TV on Friday evening the Message Stick program featured scenes and stories from the apology to the Stolen Generations! I found myself profoundly moved by the stories all over again! Sorry Day was mostly about the process of taking indigenous children to be raised as white Australians with the expectation that they might become "white" and that indigenous Australians might just fade away. I just cannot erase from my heart and mind the terrible pain suffered by the grieving parents (especially the mothers) as children were removed. In some cases whole families of five and more children were taken. And so we continue to pray for the process of reconciliation which still has a long way to go to heal that pain and to bring about a better deal for indigenous Australians.*

*In the gospel reading Jesus speaks about action which grows out of hearing "these words of mine"! Then in the letter to the Romans Paul speaks about grace as the gift of God received through faith while the action of works of the law is no basis for pride. It is impossible to separate faith and action! God's grace inspires faith which leads to action and that action leads us to lean even more on the grace of God.*
