Greetings to all!

Jeannette McHugh first came to St Philip's as a St Mark's ministry student in the early 1990's when Doug Bannerman was our parish priest.

Accepted by the diocesan panel for ordination to the priesthood, Jeannette was deaconed at Bathurst cathedral in July 1996, as a placement for her in the C&G diocese could not be found. A wonderful little band of St Philip's supporters travelled to be with her on that very special occasion. Jeannette had been employed part-time at St Philip's between rectors, and during David Oliphant's bereavement leave after the death of his wife, Rebecca. Remaining at St Philip's until December 1996 Jeannette was then appointed curate at Parkes in central NSW, and learnt about rural ministry as the first Anglican woman minister in the parish. Jeannette had particular responsibility for Peak Hill (50ks away on the road to Dubbo).

On June 20th, 1998, Jeannette and Genieve Blackwell, who is now Archdeacon for Rural Ministry and rector of Yass, were priested in the Bathurst diocese.

In January 1999, Jeannette became parish priest of Cudal, a small rural parish with 4 worship centres about 40 ks from Orange. While at Cudal she started an Op shop called Angela's in the main street, and each year would take back clothes left over from St Philip's fetes. Angela, who had been an angel outside the op-shop, became 'Pandora' when Jeannette returned to Canberra in February 2003. Financial difficulties in the bush meant it was increasingly difficult to support a resident parish priest at Cudal.

Since being back in Canberra, Jeannette has been a member of St Philips, and with Doug and Linda, is one of our honorary clergy. Between 2003 -06 she worked part-time in two community groups, and is now enjoying being retired, doing voluntary work, and being closer to her children and 4 grandchildren.
