Dear Friends,

I am very glad to welcome you to St Philip's this morning as we gather for our Eucharist on this Advent Sunday – once again the commencement of the cycle of the Church's year. In particular, Advent Sunday begins the season of four Sundays' preparation for the Christmas festival. To reflect this, the emphasis and atmosphere of the liturgy changes.

We begin with the ceremony of the Advent Wreath which involves members of the congregation and focuses on the prophetic word pointing to the coming of the Light of the World.

Today also we launch the Christmas Bowl Appeal for 2008, the 60th Christmas Bowl since its beginning in 1949. Christmas Bowl supports projects aimed to reduce poverty, protect refugees, prevent conflict and empower communities – at the moment in 22 countries across Asia, the Middle East, Africa, the Pacific and Australia. Christmas Bowl envelopes are

available today, and there is an accompanying small leaflet containing information about one of the projects. It is also a very great delight today to be able to welcome Belinda (Bel) Young to St Philip's as she commences her ministry as the parish's Children's Ministry Co-ordinator. At the beginning of the 10.00am Sung Eucharist we will have a brief commissioning of Belinda as she begins this ministry with us. There will be an opportunity to meet with her during morning tea. Please introduce yourself to her..

Thank you to everyone who contributed so much to the Parish Memorial Service for Rob Lamerton last Sunday evening. It was a very moving time of thanksgiving and celebration of his life and ministry, especially here at St Philip's. Next Sunday evening there will be the Ceremony of Carols, to be followed by a very enjoyable supper. I hope you can come along to this special Advent occasion.

Leader: God of new beginnings,
bless this Advent wreath and
help us to prepare our lives for the coming of your Son,
who brings us out of darkness into his own glorious light.
We pray in Christ's name. **Amen.**

Lighting the First Candle – The Candle of Hope

Leader: Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord

All: **Thanks be to God.**

Leader: Today is the First Sunday of Advent, in which we recall the hope we have in Christ

Reader: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in the land of deep darkness – on them

light has shined...For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9.2,6)

Reader: Today we remember the prophets of old, who demanded to be heard, who dared to speak of a child to be born, unexpected liberator of the people, vulnerable incarnation of the message of hope, a new understanding of God.

All: **Today we give thanks for the prophets among us, who bring to us surprising new visions of hope, who challenge us to think outside the square, who show us a future we never anticipated.**

Reader: On this First Sunday of Advent, we light this candle as a symbol of the prophets who renew our hope and remind us of what may be.

The first candle is lit

Sing: TiS 286 **Light one candle for hope,
one bright candle for hope.
He brings hope to every heart.
He comes! He comes!** [repeat]

The Collect

Eternal God,
through generations you prepared a way
for the coming of your Son,
and by your Spirit you still bring light to illumine our paths,
renew us in faith, hope and love
that we may welcome Christ to transform us and our world,
to whom be glory forever. **Amen.**

The Commissioning of Ms Belinda Young Children's Ministry Co-ordinator

From the Clergy Appointment Board

The formal process for choosing a new Rector will not start until next year. In the meantime and to feed into the formal process, we as a Parish need to do some thinking about our requirements and our future. Things we are required to address with the Bishop or his delegate include the Strengths of the Parish, Weaknesses of the Parish, Most important needs of the Parish, Hopes and plans for the future and the Personal qualities seen to be important in a new Priest. We expect that, in addition to the activity of the Clergy Appointment Board, the whole Parish will have the opportunity to meet with the Bishop or his delegate during the process.

Please take some time to think of these things, pray about them and write down the thoughts which come to you. It is very important that these are passed on to us for consideration when the time comes.

After meeting with the Parish Council and discussing the practical issues involved, may we also add that the deadline for the return of your thoughts will be Sunday 21 December 2008. This will allow time for the next stage in the process, which is to collate all ideas into a draft Parish Profile document for presentation to the Parish and the Bishop.
