ST PHILIP'S HEARING LOOP

St Philip's will soon be trialing a hearing loop in the church. This is a device that enables people with hearing aides to hear more easily. Today many buildings and telephones are 'looped' i.e they have induction loop facilities for hearing impaired people who wear a hearing aid that is fitted with a T-switch (or telecoil). This T-switch on your aid may help you to hear speakers or programs more clearly, especially if there is background noise. To benefit from the hearing loop, people with hearing aids need to be sure the T-switch (or telecoil) in their aid has been activated. If you are unsure please visit your audiologist or hearing specialist and request their assistance. The option selected needs to be 'telecoil and microphone'. KEY POINTS FROM AUGUST PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

As part of its review of outreach, the Parish Council is looking at the way we provide information about St. Philip's and its activities and the way we welcome visitors and newcomers. This includes brochures on St. Philip's, church notice boards, updating the Parish Calendar more regularly and making it and brochures more available, email distribution lists, the website and disabled ramps. Any ideas parishioners have would be welcome.

In its mid-year review of the parish budget, the Council noted that:

- Parish expenditure to date is some \$5000 below that projected for the end of July.
- But it needs to be remembered that our budget is based on a planned deficit for the year of \$10,500.
- And there is urgent expenditure required over the next month on the Kindergarten roof and associated drainage.
- On the income side of the budget, giving is approximately \$3500 below where it was projected to be by the end of July.
- Overall, the budget is in reasonable shape at the moment.
- The Council encourages parishioners to review their giving at least once per year.

Pandora's is looking at funding an additional storage shed for its operations to be located between Pandora's and the QE2.

St. Philips Care at the Northbourne Community Centre is currently well-funded thanks to generous support from the Wellness Foundation, The Snow Foundation and ADRA.

The solar panels will be installed on the Church Hall roof in early September.

The Council has obtained professional landscaping advice on the options for the car park surface.
