Dear Friends,

It is good to be leading the morning services for the next three weeks. Thank you for the privilege. I have checked with Rebecca and it is fine with her if today and next week, instead of our usual Second Order service, we will be using two different orders of service from the prayer book.

As I have said to some of you, I am very fond of the Third Order because it is what I introduced to the people in the rural parish of Cudal, NSW, and they liked it.

Why? Probably because it is shorter than the usual second order and easier to follow, as all you need to do is turn over each page to get to the next bit! I also especially value some lines of scripture that are in it. Next week will be Praise, Prayer and Proclamation followed by Holy Communion - with suitable hymns of praise.

Today is a very important day for the Roman Catholic Church with the proclamation of their first Australian Saint, Mary MacKillop, so I thought that it would be appropriate that we reflect on her life and work, and that we should sing hymns which most likely would have been sung in 'Church of England' rural and city parishes during her lifetime.

You might be wondering about the first one - All people that on earth do dwell - and after looking at the words thinking "well that's why we don't sing it now!" However, I quote a very authoritative source: 'This paraphrase, the earliest in English of the Jubilate Deo (psalm 100) is one of the best metrical versions ever made, and from the time of its writing one of the best loved. It appeared in 3 collections in 1561.' Our Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, chose it as the entry hymn for the service of his enthronement, and it was also sung at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth 11 - the first congregational hymn to be included in the ceremonies of an English coronation. So let us sing this very venerable hymn strongly and with confidence! It is part of our heritage.

Let us also remember with confidence and love our former rector, Rob Lamerton, who died on this day, 17th October, two years ago. We will hear some music he dearly loved during communion.

May God's grace and peace be with us all, Jeannette.
