### KEY POINTS FROM APRIL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

- The Parish Council has appointed a Master Plan Group to consider a master plan for the church site and property. The members are Rebecca, Fiona Dyer, Leighton Mann and Roger Sharp. They would welcome any thoughts parishioners have on this matter.
- During the month of May the mission focus will be the ABM Christian Care Centre project in the Solomon Islands. The centre is a refuge for women and children suffering abuse. The decision at the AGM was to provide \$1500 to the project.
- The Council continued its discussion of the needs of the children's ministry and welcomed the contribution of ideas from the Rev. Jeanette McHugh. There will be further consultation with parents and other parishioners.
- The Council noted that at the end of March giving from envelopes and loose plate was \$1600 less than the projected income from these sources for the first three months of the 2011 budget year.
- A copy of the AGM minutes will be placed on the noticeboard.  
 The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Wednesday 4 May.
