From our Rector

Welcome to St Philip's!

Today is Back to Church Sunday (BTCS). What is that (?), you may be wondering! BTCS began in Australia in 2009 when Bishop Michael Harvey from the UK core team cast the vision of Back To Church Sunday to the Rev. Stuart Robinson, National Facilitator for Missions. Stuart sowed seeds by sharing the idea of Back To Church Sunday with colleagues across Australia. At the same time he trialed BTCS in his home parish. Stuart of course is now our own diocesan bishop. BTCS is a very simple concept - it just means that for one specific Sunday of the year we invite friends, neighbours and families 'back to church'. Here at St Philip's we have taken a very low key approach.

What we will experience today is pretty much what happens every Sunday - traditional hymns, a communion service, some preaching, morning tea but above all our fellowship. St Philip's is an inclusive, friendly and welcoming church -at least that is how we try and be! We are also a community that has a strong ethos of care for each other, the wider community and the environment. Pandora's, St Philip's Care at Northbourne, Pastoral Care at Calvary, Food @ St Philip's and array of photovoltaic panels on the hall roof are just some examples.

The fact that you cannot see the panels is a sign of one of the characteristics of our parish. A great deal goes on behind the scenes with people giving generously of their time and energy to support the ministry and outreach of this place. We also love our worship and indeed that is perhaps our most important activity. For 50 years St Philip's has been a centre for Anglican worship in the O'Connor, Lyneham and Turner neighbourhoods (as well as for people who travel from further afield). Our Lord Jesus taught that we were to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. The first and most important way we do that is through our praise and worship.

If you are visiting us, for any reason, if you are here every week or anything in between, I hope you find today a blessing and a chance to connect to your God and others in hospitality and love.
