- 5 Nevertheless, my soul, wait in silence for God:

- 6 He only is my rock and my salvation:
my strong tower, so that I shall not be moved.
- 7 In God is my deliverance and my glory:
God is my strong rock and my shelter.
- 8 Trust in him at all times, O my people:
pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.
- 9 The children of Adam are but breath, the children of earth are a lie:
place them in the scales and they fly upward, they are as light as air.
- 10 Put no trust in extortion, do not grow worthless by robbery:
if riches increase, set not your heart upon them.
