From our visiting priest, Canon Scott Cowdell

I was delighted when my friend, The Reverend Rebecca Newland, invited me to be with you for three weeks in October during her holidays. Some of you may know me. I have lived in Canberra for ten years, the first half as rector of St Paul's, Manuka, and subsequently as a research fellow at the Barton campus of Charles Sturt University, where I am an associate professor of theology. My regular Sunday commitment is at All Saints', Ainslie, as an honorary associate priest.

Each Sunday I propose to give you a paragraph summing-up my sermon. Here goes for this week...

The young man in today's Gospel reading saw the implications of Jesus' demand, yet so attached was he to his status advantages over others that he would not risk his status by opening himself to Jesus. So it's not primarily wealth that Jesus challenges here, but the sort of status anxiety that's attached to property, to name, to pedigree, along with wealth, all of which enables someone to feel that they're a cut above the rest. Jesus, however, is inviting the young man, and us, to a new way of living beyond all such business as usual—to a life beyond all 'the empty display and false values of the world', as our baptism liturgy puts it. This sort of thing is what makes the world go round for so many people, but not for Jesus. He stood with the outsiders in life and in death, thinking so little of his own status that he gave up everything for the Kingdom of God. This is the dangerous freedom of Jesus, who truly marches to a different drummer, and so can we who follow him; so can we who bear the mark of his cross on our foreheads in baptism; so can we who eat his flesh and drink his blood, which are given to us in this Eucharist only through the scandal and disgrace of Calvary.
