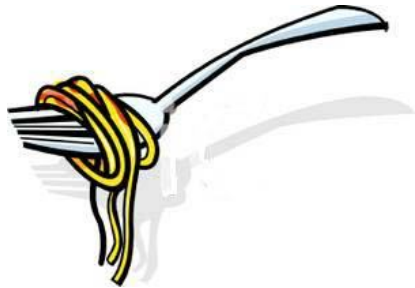

From our visiting priest Scott Cowdell.

I am enjoying my chance to be with you over these three weeks of Rebecca's annual leave, and once again I offer a condensed summary of what I am trying to get across in my sermon on today's readings. The theme that occurs to me is how God might be present in the midst of human suffering

In Jesus Christ, God stands with us under the conditions of our fragility and vulnerability, and calls us to share Jesus' solidarity with the pain of all creation. Here is where the disciples of Jesus need to be—not seeking a place of comfort and reassurance, of closure and certainty, like the disciples in today's Gospel passage but, rather, living in the world with all its pain and uncertainty; not offering answers, necessarily, but certainly offering ourselves.

And I think, when it comes down to it, that people want the solidarity more than they want the closure. This brings us back to our Eucharist today: church isn't a place where all questions are answered, and all doubts removed. Rather, the Eucharist is a place of profound divine-human solidarity. And it's a sign that hope abides: a resurrection sign, no matter what.
