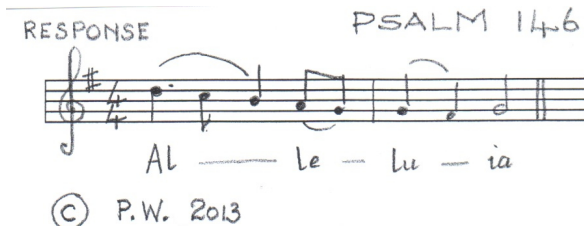
Sentence of the day: Barnabas was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord.
