11 I will declare the mighty acts of the Lord:

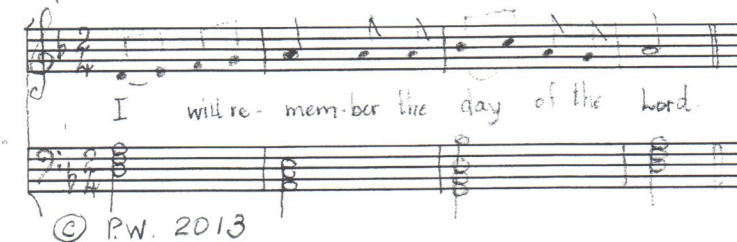
