**Sentence of the day:** At the name of Jesus, every knee shall bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God The Father.

### Psalm 31.9-18:

- 9 Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am in trouble:  
my eye wastes away for grief, my throat also and my inward parts.
- 10 For my life wears out in sorrow, and my years with sighing:  
my strength fails me in my affliction, and my bones are consumed.
- 11 I am become the scorn of all my enemies:  
and my neighbours wag their heads in derision.
- 12 I am a thing of horror to my friends:  
and those that see me in the street shrink from me.
- 13 I am forgotten like one dead and out of mind:

- 14 For I hear the whispering of many:
