WEEK OF PRAYER FOR RECONCILIATION 2013

For many years, the Anglican Church of Australia has set aside a period of time to focus upon issues which are now called 'reconciliation'.

Each year, the Week of Prayer for Reconciliation starts on May 27th, the anniversary of the 1967 Referendum, and finishes on June 3rd, sometimes known as 'Mabo Day', the anniversary of the High Court's 1992 Mabo judgment which was a major landmark in the recognition of Indigenous land rights in Australia.

*God of holy dreaming, Great Creator Spirit
From the dawn of creation you have given your
children the good things of Mother Earth.
You spoke and gum tree grew.*

*In vast deserts and dense forest, and in cities at
the water's edge, creation sings your praise.
Your presence endures as the rock at the heart of
