## FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I found the following in a book given to me for my birthday.

One night bandits came to the hermitage of an old monastic and said: "We have come to take everything in your cell." And the monastic said, "Take whatever you see, my sons." The bandits gathered up everything they found and went away. But they left behind a little bag with silver candlesticks. When the monastic saw it, he picked it up and ran after them, shouting. "Take these, take these. You forgot them and they are the most beautiful of all".

As Christmas approaches (only 4 sleeps!) it strikes me that this little story can teach us so much about possessions, giving and the quality of beauty. Perhaps I am turning into a middle aged grump but I do not see many signs of beauty or indeed outrageous generosity as exemplified by this old monastic. In our shops it is all cheap tinsel and more consumer goods sold to a population that already has too much. But at the heart of Christmas is the outrageously generous gift of God of God's very self in Christ our Lord. It is a gift given to a world that shows little sign of deserving such a gift. It is a gift that is beautiful since it opens for us the way of peace and reconciliation, salvation and wholeness. As Isaiah writes (52.7) and Paul cites in Romans (10.15) 'how beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news'. As you ponder what you will give and receive this season I encourage you to think about what is beautiful that you can share and give away. Is it the precious beauty and gift of your time? Is it the compassion and patience you can offer to those around you? Is it a gift of money that can support the mission and values of a worthwhile charity? Something beautiful is not necessarily a material object. Something beautiful is what brings love and hope. If it is freely and unconditionally given it shines. Advent Blessings, Rebecca
