Dear Friends,

I was having my hair cut at the coast on Wednesday and it was my first time into the particular hairdressers. The lady cutting my hair was doing the normal 'get to know you' thing and asked lots of questions about where I lived and all the rest. Eventually she asked, 'so are you working in hospitality since you work weekends'? I replied - 'well, not really, but yes I suppose I am sort of'. What I should have said was, "YES!
