and in whose spirit their is no guile. **R**
3. For I held my tongue;
my bones wasted away through my groaning all the day long.
4. You hand was heavy upon me day and night;
my moisture was dried up like a drought in summer. **R**
5. Then I acknowledged my sin to you
and my iniquity I did not hide.
6. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord";
and you forgave the guilt of my sin. **R**
7. Therefore let all the faithful make their prayers to
you in time of trouble;
in the great water flood, it shall not reach them.
8. You are a place for me to hide in, you preserve me from trouble.
You surround me with songs of deliverance. **R**
9. I will instruct you and teach in the way that you should go;
I will guide you with my eye.
10. Be not like horse and mule which have no understanding;
whose mouths must be held with and bridle,
or else they will not stay near you. **R**
11. Great tribulations remain for the wicked;
but mercy embraces those who trust in the Lord.

From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Through Lent, as well as singing the psalms, I thought it would be good to write on them a little - space allowing! The book of Psalms is actually a collection of collections. They were written over many centuries, stretching from the days of Solomon's temple (about 950 BC) to after the Exile (about 350 BC.) They are the great prayers and hymns of the Hebrew people, of Jesus Christ and the early church. They are the prayers of the abandoned and oppressed, the congregation and the loner, the meditator and the musician, the victor and the vanquished. In the book of psalms are songs of praise, lament, repentance, doubt, fear, wonder and wisdom. One biblical scholar called the psalms humanities words to God and God's word to humanity. Some psalms are incredibly difficult to pray. Others just slide off the tongue like they are embedded in your heart. They all have something to teach us about ourselves, God and the nature of prayer.
