From the Editor

The is the third of Dr Cowdell's three weeks of ministry with us. Thank you, Scott. You have blessed us greatly. Rebecca returns next Sunday.

The name of the game of cricket probably comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *cricc* ('crook'), meaning a shepherd's staff. The first players may have been sixteenth-century English shepherds, using their criccs as bats and the *wicket* or gate of the sheep pen as a target for the ball.

Picture the scene: a lush green field surrounded by a hedge, with plentiful water nearby. The field is filled with plump sheep wandering around without care or fear. The shepherd has little to do but watch and maybe play cricket. To move the sheep, the shepherd uses a trained sheep dog. At night the shepherd secures the sheep in their enclosure and goes home to bed.

Now forget the scene *and* the cricket, for none of it applies to ancient middle eastern sheep and their shepherd. The "green pastures" and "still waters" of Psalm 23 were not the common experience of sheep in the rocky dry country of ancient Israel. Rather, the psalm speaks of a Lord who shepherds us into a place of nourishment and refreshment that surpass the everyday. And we are told of a home in the Lord's house—where, like the sheep in a fold, we will be together, like it or not!

(But I'm sure we will like it.)

The Parish of Oberon: our partner parish

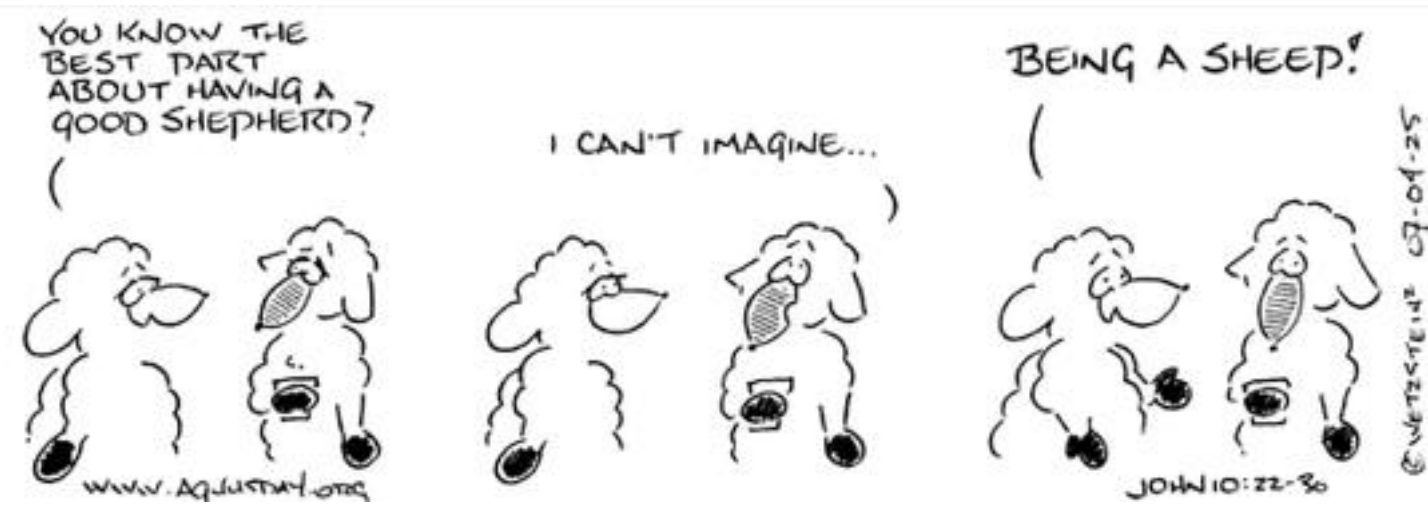
