## FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Our sentence for today are those wonderful words from Paul's letter to the Romans, "Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for whoever loves one another has fulfilled the law" (13.8). Paul has just written about what is 'due' by way of obligation towards civil authorities. He now stresses the most fundamental Christian obligation: that of love. This love is to reach out to everyone. I sometimes think that Christians can go on about love without really thinking through what it means. Well perhaps I should say I can do that! However, to understand what this love is we can keep looking in and pondering what we find in scripture, particularly the New Testament and the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. The life of Christ is a window into love and its expression. This is why to follow Jesus is to love like Jesus and to love like Jesus is to fulfil the law of God. It is as simple and as difficult as that. No one can love as perfectly as Jesus but everyone can choose to try, to model their love and life on his, to learn and grow in love, to open themselves to the help of the Spirit and to not give up - no matter the failures, the doubt and difficulties we face.

What the world really does need is love, the love of Christ.
