#### FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends, As you may have read in the notices, this last monday, 22nd of September, St Philip's received a substantial bequest from the late Carola Parke, a long standing parishioner of our community. This bequest is extraordinarily generous. The council knew that an amount would be given once Carola's will was processed but we had not idea when or how much. Parish council will work very slowly and carefully to make sure Carola's generosity and this amazing blessing is used wisely and for the love of God. No major decisions will be implemented until after prayer, reflection, consultation and the 2015 AGM.

As I have begun to process this wonderful gift I have been reminded that large sums of money will change things. I hope and pray that we will never lose sight of who we are as a unique Christian community. Our shared values of inclusion, caring, relationships, relevance and worship are key signposts as we move into this next phase of our life together. It would be so sad if we no longer worked together with such grace, humour, understanding and commitment. God, through Carola's generosity, has indeed been good to us. This whole parish is a place of generosity and loving service. As Paul says in the New Testament, may we hold fast to that which is good. I have every reason to believe we will do just that.

Also, over the last week James, our administrative assistant, and I have been reviewing his position and working arrangements. As you know three months ago I gave up 10 hours of my paid stipend which enabled us to employ someone for 14 hours a week as an administrative assistant. From both James and my perspective this arrangement has been very successful, life-giving I would say for me. Given that James really only does what I was doing (or rather not doing or doing badly), he does not have a great deal of time to become the 'parish administrative assistant' and so I ask us all to be conscious of not weighing him down with things we would normally have attended to ourselves if possible. James is very gracious and generous with his time but we must be fair and reasonable!
