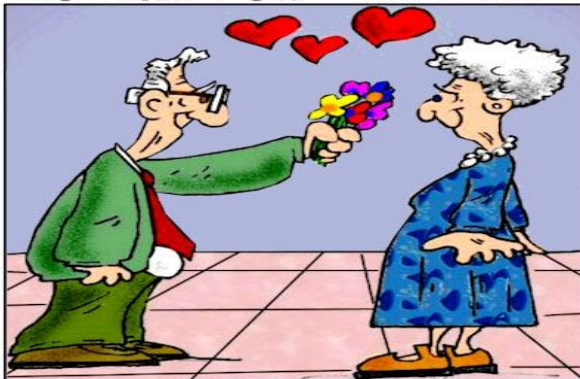
## Psalm 45.1-2, 6-9
