## *From our Acting Rector*

Dear Friends,

Sea Sunday is being celebrated today all around the world. There is information and resources on the website. A resource from the Seafarers mission in Hong Kong has information about life on board ships and the role of the Mission to Seafarers today. It is on the blue sheet which has the gospel hymn 'Throw out the Life line'.

Three statements caught my attention. Firstly, 95% of the world's commodities are transported to the world's markets by ship. Secondly, in 2012, when it was written, 1.2 million seafarers were involved in crewing over 50,000 ocean going vessels. And thirdly, it

notes that in many cases the crew can be away from home and family 6-9 months of the year, and the stays in ports are much shorter than they were in the past.

The chaplaincy work of pastoral and spiritual care is provided to all seafarers regardless of race or religion. It may be that this is one area where the different religions are working well together. Living inland it is easy to become unaware of the magnitude of this seaborne trade. The Seafarers Mission deserves our support and prayer.
