When I was in ministry in central NSW, I was fortunate to attend some training weekends in Sydney in the ministry of healing. I also spent a very special time in private conversation with Canon Jim Glennon, who established the Healing Ministry in St Andrews Cathedral.

I listened to one of his tapes, and I still find his very short

prayer for healing the most helpful one I know. I am sure that if I should be in need of healing that it is the prayer I would return to every day.

"I give thanks for the healing that has begun, and is continuing."

That's because, as Jim Glennon says, you only have to ask God once, you don't need to keep asking him. If you have faith that healing can be influenced by prayer, then all one has to do is give thanks for the healing that is continuing. The prayer is so short and simple. One can offer it to anyone for their own use, and use it for oneself should the need arise. I offer it now, and pray that we all can give thanks for continuing good health.
