Psalm 104.1-10, 26

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul:
 O Lord my God, how great you are!
- 2 Clothed with majesty and honour:
 wrapped in light as in a garment.
- 3 You have stretched out the heavens like a tent-cloth:
 and laid the beams of your dwelling upon their waters;
- 4 You make the clouds your chariot:
 and ride upon the wings of the wind;

 and flames of fire your ministers;

 so that it shall never be moved.

From the Locum Tenens Rector

Psalm 104:1-10, 26 (NRSV 1-9, 24) elaborates Psalm 103:19-22, which celebrates the reign of God in creation. The two psalms are linked by the words "Bless the Lord O my soul" and while Psalm 103 is a song of God's compassion and faithfulness Psalm 104 celebrates beauty in and care of creation. They are both songs of the praise of God. They are also songs of God's power and thus for a backdrop to the other readings. The powerful creator is also the suffering servant. God uses God's power for the benefit of all to God's great cost.

The psalmist affirms God's sovereignty in 1-4 over all things and the words suggest that God's real home is not the Temple but the created universe. Chaos and confusion are not God's way (5-9). This is a great psalm for reflecting on the natural order created as the home of God. Everything is interdependent in the universe and grounded in the compassion of God. Because of the created order and through it we praise God. Destroying or abusing it is an affront to God, much more than destroying and abusing church buildings. It is the source of the praise of God.

- Rev'd Andrea will continue with her family ministry until the end of the year. Grant funding from the Pelican Foundation for the family and cross-cultural program was received for 2013, 2014 and 2015 but there will be no extension of the funding into 2016. Parish Council is in discussion with Andrea about her availability in 2016.

- An application has been lodged with the Snow Foundation for funding for the Northbourne Community Centre program for the next three years. Many thanks to Rosemary Knight assisted by Rev'd Robin, Liz Drysdale and Shane Woodburn for preparing the application.
- A working bee to complete the installation of the concrete sleeper garden edging along the Macpherson Street footpath is planned for Saturday 7 November, 8am–10a.m. Strong helpers needed please.
- A pre-Advent working bee to clean and prepare the church and courtyard for Advent services and events is proposed for 21 November from 9am-12. Many helpers/families needed to help.
