## From the Rector

Dear Friends,

"The Trinity is a matter of five notions or properties, four relations, three persons, two processions, one substance or nature, and no understanding!!" It is easier to sing about than to explain! But...it is the foundation upon which our faith is constructed, if someone asks us to 'explain' God the Trinity should be the first thing on our lips, but more often than not it isn't because it is all too difficult.

We here at St Philip's use the creeds of the church and our worship is very Trinitarian in shape: Look carefully at the prayer book you will find that there are many threefold prayers and our collects are prayed to God, in Christ through the Spirit. But there are of course issues that we need to be mindful of. We live in a very different world to those of the 4th Century who framed our creeds, but that doesn't mean that we reject this most important Christian concept. I'd like to offer two ideas that may help – acknowledging that this is a difficult philosophical and theological idea.

Many would claim that the idea of God as Father and Son is difficult because 50% of us cannot be fathers or sons. (spirit is easier!) And after all are we not all made in God's image? This is true; in using this language we are of course following Jesus who clearly used these terms. However it is really important to remember that Jesus dares to call God Abba, an address of astounding intimacy. He smashes the contemporary stereotypes of fatherhood in his culture. The Father in the story of the Prodigal Son is an important figure in this regard. Paul Ricoeur the French philosopher wrote: 'calling God Father is a prophetic act

which does not look back to a great ancestor but forward in the direction of a new intimacy.'

So we use the term Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which is consistent with our biblical faith. But we must recognise the axiom 'God is what God does,' this too is very important. We here at St Philip's also address God as Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier. You will hear both of these ascriptions as we worship and celebrate God in our Christian tradition.

We might be tempted to consider all this as idle philosophical speculation. But our doctrine of God has immense practical application. It is the bedrock of our understanding of relationship and reconciliation, it is something we must hold fast to. Today as much as any other time in our history.

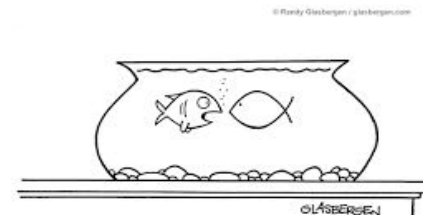
