## From the Rector

Dear Friends

In 1848 William John Butler, the then 29 year old Vicar of Wantage in England, founded The Community of St Mary the Virgin to undertake what was described as 'rescue work.' It was one of the first Anglican Religious Communities to be founded in England since the Dissolution of the Monasteries by Henry VIII. In 1849, Harriet Day, a farmer's daughter, came to assist The Reverend William Butler in the formation of this new Sisterhood and, in 1854, she was installed by Samuel Wilberforce, (son of William the slave trade abolitionist) then Bishop of Oxford, as the first Reverend Mother, a position she held for 33 years. The Rule - concerning the Community's ethos and aspirations first appeared in print together with the Constitution in 1896. It was from that time the Sisters took vows of poverty, chastity and obedience to God before the Bishop of Oxford or his nominee.

In 1888 Sister Esther, while a novice of the Community of St Mary the Virgin, suffered an accident which led her to come to Australia to recuperate. In Melbourne she was asked to help establish the Anglican welfare mission known as the Diocesan Mission to the Streets and Lanes. Sister Esther realized that, within this

mission, God was calling her to form a new Community. She went on to establish the Community of the Holy Name and for more than 50 years the Community operated soup kitchens, mother's groups, children's homes and hospitals in Victoria.

Anglicare was founded upon the legacy of Mother Esther and is now the Anglican Church's social justice arm.

Today we celebrate Anglicare Sunday, giving thanks for the work of outreach undertaken by Anglicare on our behalf. Anglicare's mission is to tackle disadvantage, helping children and families break free from the cycle of poverty. Its work focuses on helping children, young people and families who are homeless or in crisis through the Survive and Thrive approach. We also support parents to make sure their children are school ready, and stay engaged with school and post-school training. Remarkably the work of Anglicare remains much the same as those pioneers in the 1880s. Today Ann Munro will address us and help us understand the crucial role that Anglicare plays in our community.

Canon Scott has had his knees 'done' and is doing well. I will visit him this afternoon and will convey our greetings and good wishes, as well as the sacrament (of course)!
