## From the Rector

Dear Friends

Last weekend a Pastoral Letter was read in church reading the adoption by the Diocesan Synod of the National Redress Scheme for the victims of child sexual abuse. A copy of the letter is on the notice board in the foyer if you wish to read it. The Royal Commission made comment on the difficulty of dealing with the Anglican Church because of our polity – 23 independent dioceses. So the General Synod has formed a body to deal with the redress scheme and individual dioceses can vote to be a part of it, as we have in this diocese. Hopefully there will be a unified approach from the Church.

There are critics of the scheme both from within and outside the Church. It is far from perfect, but in our Diocese and others it does operate alongside an existing scheme which will continue to provide restitution and care to those who come forward. There is no perfect answer to this terrible tragedy.

Jesus speaks about children a number of times in the gospel, Matthew describes a dreadful punishment for those who would 'scandalize any one of these little ones.' He uses the Greek word mikroi – little ones and its use is much discussed. Does he mean children or those who are vulnerable or of insignificant social status? Either way we have a calling to care for those most vulnerable in our community, this includes children and adolescents. In today's gospel reading from Mark Jesus takes a child in his arms and tells the disciples that 'Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.' I think this is quite clear.

We in the parish have done much to ensure that our policies and procedures meet with modern standards and expectations. I am very grateful to the Parish Council and the Wardens who work hard to ensure our compliance in this area. We have recently completed policy on our privacy measures particularly in regard to Social Media. All this

work takes time and effort, but today's reading reminds us it is of the Gospel.

The congregation at 8.00am has grown over the months and we enjoy Breakfast together after the service. The Thursday morning Eucharist too is a wonderful opportunity for morning tea following the 10.00 service. These times of fellowship are all part of our vocation to offer hospitality and to live out the Eucharistic spirituality we profess. Come along!

As I write we are in the throes of preparation for our Spring Fling. Thank you to all those who have worked so hard to ensure it is a great day. I might even be tempted to pray for good weather!
